Marine Spatial Planning (MSP)

MSP is the governance process of collaboratively assessing and managing the spatial and temporal distribution of human activities to achieve economic, social and ecological objectives.















Marine Spatial Planning

The Department of Environmental Affairs, Forestry and Fisheries (DEFF) has been designated by Cabinet as the lead Authority for Marine Spatial Planning


DEFF collaborates with all authorities that have mandate in the South African Ocean Space and facilitates the MSP process

Marine Spatial Planning is a strategic development of the Operation Phakisa: Ocean Economy Initiative that aims to:

- Unlocking the ocean economy
- Enabling society to engage with the ocean
- Ensuring a healthy marine ecosystem
- Good ocean governance











Marine Spatial Planning

Marine Spatial Planning Act, No. 16 of 2018

- To provide a framework for marine spatial planning in South Africa
- To provide for the development of marine spatial plans
- To provide for institutional arrangements for the implementation of marine spatial plans and governance of the use of the ocean by multiple sectors







Operation Phakisa

- Integrated Coastal Management
- Marine Spatial Planning
- Marine Protected Areas

Marine Spatial Planning

- MSP Act
- MSP Framework
- National Data and Information Report

Four Marine Area Plans

Applies to the entire South African Ocean

- MSP goals
- General Development Guidelines
- Sector Development Objectives
- Zoning principles

Applies to specific planning area

- Sector Development Guidelines
- Zoning regulations

The process so far

Timeline

2014

 MSP prioritized as initiative 10 under Oceans Economy: Operation Phakisa

2015

• MSP-National Working Group established

2017

• National MSP Framework provides high-level guidance

2019

Marine Spatial Planning Act (Act No.16 of 2018) provides legal basis

2020

• National MSP Data and Information Report provides evidence-base





Currently: Sector Plan Development

Each sector now needs to specify its "spatial ask" as input to the MSP: What does each sector want and where?

These "sector plans" will then be integrated across sectors to develop agreed, negotiated marine area plans.
