Miss Carla Dodd, one of the CMR's PhD students, was selected for a specialised field training programme out of a group of postgrads from across Africa. The Train-ME2 Connect Summer School took place from 20 to 27 November eight postgraduate hosted students from six different nationalities (Nigeria, Madagascar, Mozambique, Tanzania, South Africa and Zimbabwe). The Summer School is a training programme that focuses on bio- and geological sampling techniques in both aquatic and terrestrial environments and the application thereof palaeoecology.

The students were joined by the trans-disciplinary team of researchers from the Universities of Cape Town (Dr Kelly Kirsten), Greifswald (Dr Finn Viehberg), KwaZulu Natal (Dr Jemma Finch and Dr Lauren Pretorius), and Nelson Mandela University/Council for Geoscience (Dr Hayley Cawthra) who facilitated the programme.

Dr Estee Miltz's doctoral thesis, entitled Applying a Systems Analysis Approach to Support Integrated Ocean Management and Marine Spatial Planning in Algoa Bay, South Africa, was awarded the Global Challenges University Alliance Award by the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences for the thesis of the year in relevance to Sustainable Development. This high-quality research has applied a transdisciplinary, systems approach to support marine spatial planning and provided a platform for stakeholders and decision makers to conduct scenario analyses and explore sustainable management interventions to achieve a balance in social-ecological objectives across marine sectors. Dr Miltz will give a seminar about her research later during 2022 and receive a prize of 4000 Euro.
